Building a FENCE?

Do you need a permit? According to the Town of Stettler's Land Use Bylaw 2060-15 Section 15 a Development Permit is not required for:

The construction or maintenance of gates, fences, walls or other means of enclosure less than 1.22m (4 ft.) in height in front yards and less than 2.0m (6.56 ft.) in height in side and rear yards except where corner lot restrictions apply.

Please note it is the owner's responsibility to ensure that fence construction does not encroach past the property line. If you have any questions please call the Town Office at 403-742-8305.

Building a SHED or DECK?

Do you need a permit? According to the Town of Stettler's Land Use Bylaw 2060-15 Section 15 a Development Permit is not required for:

The construction or installation of an accessory building that does not exceed $9.5~\text{m}^2$ ($102~\text{ft}^2$) in area and 2.5~m (8.2~ft.) in height, provided that the structure is portable and not fixed on a permanent foundation or concrete pad; and construction of an unenclosed deck that does not exceed $15~\text{m}^2$ ($162~\text{ft}^2$) in area or does not measure more than 0.76~m (2~ft.) from grade. Please note it is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the shed or deck does not encroach into the setback requirements for an accessory building. Winter Pet Safety

During the cold winter temperatures and weather is important to remember the needs of your family pet. To help keep your furry friends safe during the winter months here are a few pet friendly tips:

- 1. When going for walks ensure your dog's feet have boots or protection from the ice and snow. Their paw pads can be susceptible to frost bite if in the cold for too long.
- 2. Don't leave your pet outside for long periods.
- 3. Dry your pet as right away from being outside to help keep their skin from drying out.
- 4. Ensure dogs and cats have Town license tags attached to their collars to help return them to you if they get lost or escape from your home.
- 5. Have your pet on a leash at all times and prevent them from running loose. Winter weather can lead to poor visibility and unpredictable ground conditions such as ice.
- 6. Inside your home, ensure all heating devices and sources are covered or protected so your pet does not come into contact with them.
