Sports Park Fundraising Committee

The Stettler Sports Park Committee is currently seeking donations to achieve its goal of fundraising \$250,000 towards the development of a district Sports Park. This park will consist of four ball diamonds and two soccer pitches built to regulation size with dugout seating, off street parking/RV parking, and provisions for a mobile concession stand. If we are able to exceed our fundraising goals further park amenities will include ball diamond lighting, batting cages, walking trails, tot lot, landscaping, etc.

To date Town of Stettler Council has donated \$250,000, and a provincial grant has been received in the amount of \$500,000 to commence the construction of this park. An additional \$48,450 in private donations has already been received from local/regional supporters. As well, we are pleased that the County of Stettler is also supporting the Park through the use of their equipment.

Donations will be recognized in the park with sponsorship levels ranging from the supporter level (\$100 - \$499) to the platinum level (\$50,000 plus). All levels of donations would be appreciated and if gifts in-kind are preferred the Sports Park Committee will be planning future fundraising events with a silent or live auction. All donations will be considered charitable and as such will be tax deductible. Thank you for your consideration in supporting our efforts to create a Sports Park.
