



## ELECTION DAY

### Municipal Election – October 21, 2013

Remember to vote on October 21, 2013 from 10:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. at the Stettler Community Hall (located at 5101 – 46 Avenue) for election of Town of Stettler Councillors. Incumbent Mayor Dick Richards has been acclaimed as the Mayor of the Town of Stettler for the next 4 years. There are eleven (11) candidates nominated for six (6) positions as Town Councillor. The candidates running for positions as Town Councillor include: Darcy Bachman, William Brown, Al Campbell, Malcolm Fischer, Zachary Jackson, Sean Nolls, Karen Sernecky, Peter Simons, James Smith, Wayne Tebbe & Steven Wildeboer. A person is eligible to vote if he/she is: at least 18 yrs old, a Canadian Citizen, has resided in Alberta for the six consecutive months immediately preceding election day and is a resident in the local jurisdiction on election day.

A person who is otherwise eligible to vote in the Town of Stettler must also make a statement in the presence of an election officer at the voting station, in the prescribed form, that the person is eligible to vote as an elector **and produces for inspection one piece of authorized identification verifying the person's identity and current residence.** A sample listing of the most common types of authorized voter identification that are acceptable to verify identity and address in accordance with the Local Authorities Election Act include:

- Operator/Driver's License;
- Government photo identification card (for non-drivers);
- Bank/Credit card Statement or personal cheque;
- Correspondence issued by a school, college or university;
- Government cheque or cheque stub;
- Income/property tax assessment notice;
- Insurance policy or coverage card;
- Statements of government benefits: pension plan, employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefits;
- Utility bill: telephone, TV, power, gas, or water;
- Vehicle ownership or insurance certificate.

Other types of identification may be acceptable to verify identity and address, an elector should check with the Returning Officer at the Town of Stettler Municipal Office (403)742-8305 or on the Town of Stettler Home Page [www.stettler.net](http://www.stettler.net)

All types. Ends of the batteries must be taped (masking tape, electrical tape).



## **FLUORESCENT BULBS/TUBES**

Must not be broken.



## **INKJETS, LASER TONERS, CELL PHONES, SMALL ELECTRONICS**

Keep ink and toners in original box, if possible.



# HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

A household hazardous waste (HHW) product has at least one of the following symbols:

It is corrosive



It is flammable



It is toxic



Improper disposal, such as pouring down the sink, pouring in the storm sewer, burning, throwing in the landfill or putting in the trash ultimately leads to contamination of our water, air and land, and can be a threat to human health.
