

### TRUCK ROUTE CHANGES

Please note that 46 Street & 47 Avenue are no longer designated truck routes. Also many trucks have been using 49 Avenue to access 46 Street from the industrial area. This road is not designated as a truck route and has been signed preventing truck traffic from using this road. The intention is to keep unnecessary truck traffic (defined as a motor vehicle, that is larger than a passenger vehicle, SUV, pick-up truck or van, and it carries cargo and transports goods, freights, commodities, livestock, etc.) out of residential areas and onto roads that are built to withstand their heavy weights. All vehicles over 1 ton shall be routed through the approved truck routes as much as possible. Any trucks that continue to use unapproved roads will be subject to fines from the RCMP and the DOT. We ask for your support in upholding the routes and keeping business traffic outside of residential areas. If you have any questions please call the Town Office at (403)742-8305. ### BACK-TO-SCHOOL: CHILDREN SAFETY
