<u>Used Oil</u> - Stettler Bottle Depot, 5005 - 48 Street (or check with your local bulk agent).

<u>Car Batteries</u> - Regional Landfill, Botha, Big Valley, Byemoor, Donalda, Erskine, Gadsby & Stettler Transfer Stations.

Explosives - Contact the RCMP Detachment.

<u>Radioactive Materials</u> - Contact Atomic Energy Control Board (403-292-5181).

<u>Biomedical Materials</u> - Contact the Hospital, Health Unit or Bovar Inc. (780-947-3354).

<u>Commercial Toxic Waste</u> - Contact Envirosort Inc. (403-342-7823).
