The Parkland Regional Library Board is required to have their current year budget approved by participating members each year. The Parkland regional Library Board requests that council approves the 2021 budget and notifies PRL in writing before November 4<sup>th</sup> so that any concerns can be addressed at the PRL Board meeting on November 12<sup>th</sup>.

Councillor Lawlor expressed his admiration for how the Parkland Regional Library navigated the circumstances of COVID-19, including the increased provision of e-content. Councillor Lawlor advised that the Parkland Regional Library's new building was completed on-schedule and on-budget. Councillor Lawlor concluded that as a rural community, our Return on Investment (ROI) with Parkland Regional Library is high.

CAO G. Switenky advised that staff have identified a gap in the current Pool/Fitness admission structure at the Stettler Recreation Centre. Staff are proposing the addition of a six (6) month pass.

Student (9-17 years of age)	\$197.00

A six month pass will provide additional flexibility for our patrons when making their choice of passes while at the same time aligning with the facilities busy time (approx. 6 months) in late fall to early spring when it is harder to get outside for fitness activity.

While Schedule G is specific to the Fitness Centre, the fees and fee structure are the same as in Schedule A. When you purchase a pass, access to the Swimming Pool and Fitness Centre are included.

Policy is set to be brought back as a whole for full review in 2022 by Council.

There are minimal, if any, budget implications. The change may result in increased 6-month vs year-long membership due to better alignment with a user's desired time of year in the building. At the same time, it may shrink the number of 3-month memberships. Any increase would be as a result of new passholders having another option that better meets their SRC usage needs.

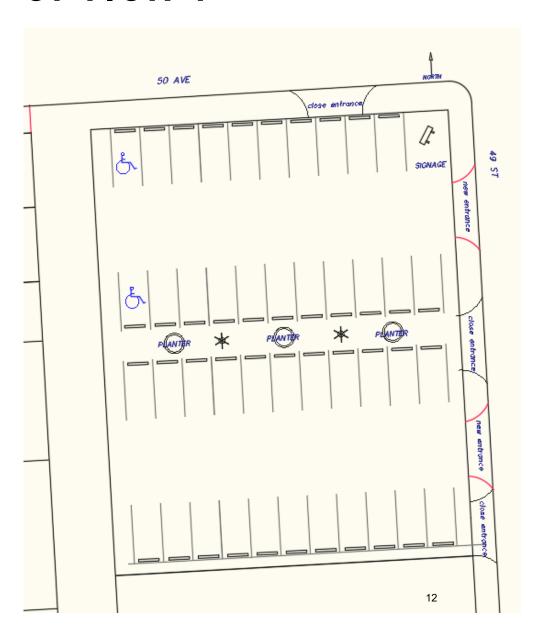

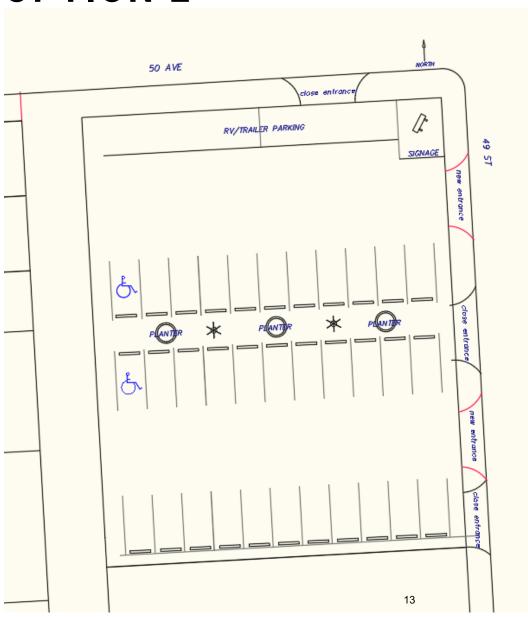

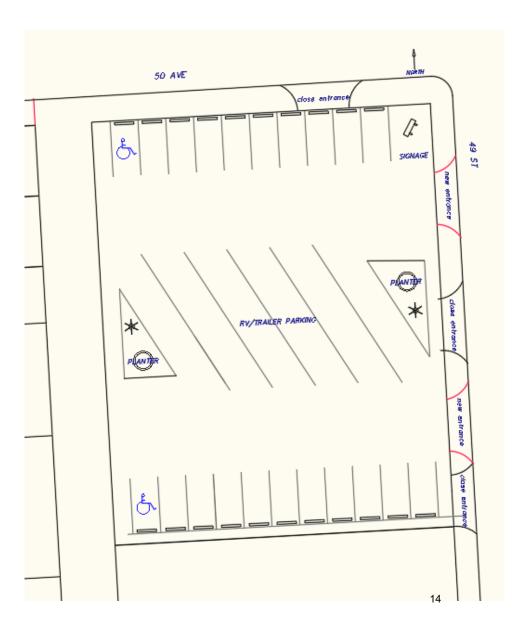

**Application:** To subdivide Lot 3, Block 2, Plan 1423578 to create three separate parcels (2.7+/-acres, 4.5 +/- acres and 26.6 +/- acres) and subsequently consolidate one of the newly subdivided

parcels (4.5 +/- acres) with the existing acreage of Lot 4, Block 2, Plan 1423578.

#### Recommendation:

That the subdivision application 2020-01 from Steven Vaughn Wilfort to subdivide Lot 3, Block 2, Plan 1423578 to create three separate parcels (2.7+/- acres, 4.5 +/- acres and 26.6 +/- acres) as shown on the Tentative Plan of Subdivision and subsequently consolidate one of the newly subdivided parcels (4.5 +/- acres) with the existing acreage of Lot 4, Block 2, Plan 1423578 as shown on the Tentative Plan of Consolidation. The application for Subdivision and Consolidation has been evaluated in terms of Section 654 of the Municipal Government Act and Section 7 of the Subdivisions and Development Regulations and having considered adjacent landowner(s)s submissions, referral agency comments, the Town of Stettler's statutory planning documents, and other related municipal planning documents.

- 1. That the application is consistent with Section 7 of the Subdivision and Development Regulations;
- 2. That the application is consistent with the policies of the Municipal Development Plan;
- 3. That the application is consistent with the Land Use Bylaw 2060-15.

Further, in accordance with Sections 654 and 655 of the Municipal Government Act, the application be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Subdivision to be effected by a Plan of Survey, pursuant to Section 657 of the Municipal Government Act.
- 2. All outstanding Property Taxes to be paid to the Town of Stettler as per Section 654 (1) (d) of the Municipal Government Act.

#### IMPLICATIONS OF RECOMMENDATION

#### General:

The applicant is proposing to subdivide Lot 3, Block 2, Plan 1423578 to create three separate parcels (2.7+/- acres, 4.5 +/- acres and 26.6 +/- acres) and subsequently consolidate one of the newly subdivided parcels (4.5 +/- acres) with the existing acreage of Lot 4, Block 2, Plan 1423578.

The proposed subdivision is to accommodate the potential sale and development of the 26.6 +/-acre parcel while protecting the peace and enjoyment of the applicants existing residential acreage parcel.

In accordance with the Area Structure Plan the future development of the parcels will require a re-zoning as well as a development permit which will address any conditions required for the development including but not limited to service connections and on site road construction. The proposed subdivision is considered serviced at the services are in 48 Avenue to the North and a service connection has been installed to the proposed parcels accessing 48 Avenue, these services were installed through a Development Agreement with the applicant during the highway commercial subdivision and development.

**Subject:** Assessment Model Review (AMR) Communications

Dear Chief Elected Official,

For more than a year, government has been working on a review of the regulated assessment models for wells, pipelines, and wellsite machinery and equipment. The review was intended to update the valuations of these properties in line with current circumstances, while promoting Alberta's competitiveness and preserving the ability of municipalities to deliver necessary services and infrastructure.

Upon being sworn in as the Minister of Municipal Affairs, I made this assessment model review (AMR) one of my top priorities. I undertook to consult extensively with municipalities and with industry. As a result, I understand and appreciate the delicate balance between the interests of municipal viability and industry competitiveness.

It is clear to me and my government colleagues that it may not be possible to strike the right balance, and do the right thing for the long term, if we implement comprehensive assessment system changes amidst the current uncertainty. Accordingly, we will not be proceeding with any of the assessment model review scenarios.

At the same time, we cannot simply maintain the status quo. The challenges facing our oil and gas sector remain, and there are specific areas where our assessment and taxation system can be improved to support Alberta's economic recovery and protect jobs in communities throughout our province.

Taking into account these considerations, as well as the constructive suggestions I have received from municipalities and industry over the past two months, I am pleased to inform you of the following government decisions:

- In order to encourage new investment, there will be a three-year "property tax holiday" for all new well and pipeline assets; these properties will receive an assessment of zero for the next three years.
- To further stimulate new drilling activity, the Well Drilling Equipment Tax will be eliminated beginning in January, 2021.
- Additional depreciation adjustments will be provided for lower-producing wells; this is expected
  to result in a reduction of approximately \$21 million in municipal taxes and \$7 million in
  education taxes provincewide.
- To promote continued viability of existing assets and companies, the shallow gas assessment reduction of 35 per cent will also be maintained for the next three years.

These measures are intended to support our economic recovery and provide much-needed certainty to industry, investors, municipalities, and other property taxpayers for the next three years. It is our intent that comprehensive changes to well, pipeline and wellsite machinery and equipment assessment models will not be enacted during this time. In the coming months, government will develop a plan for regular, future reviews of assessment models for all regulated property types, including the timing and process for such reviews.

As the impacts of these changes are much more moderate than those contemplated under the AMR, my full expectation is that municipalities will be able to accommodate any reductions in the assessment base without raising taxes on other ratepayers.

In the absence of new assessment models, assessment year modifiers (AYMs) need to be established for the 2021 tax year. These modifiers are similar to a consumer price index, and are used to adjust the property assessments for regulated industrial property from the base cost year in order to reflect current values. To support the budgeting process municipalities are currently undertaking, attached are the approved AYMs for the 2020 Assessment Year (2021 tax year). Also attached is an estimate of the property tax impacts for rural municipalities resulting from additional depreciation. Direct impacts on urban municipalities are expected to be negligible.

Municipal Affairs is completing the annual updates to the Alberta Minister's Guidelines for taxation in 2021 to include the annual change to the AYMs, as well as the changes to additional depreciation for lower-producing wells. The Provincial Assessor's office will prepare the assessments for designated industrial property including wells, pipelines, and wellsite machinery and equipment in late January 2021. The assessments will include the changes resulting from this decision, and any annual changes to the inventory.

In my brief time as Minister, I have been pleased to hear candid feedback and tough questions from municipal leaders, and I hope that will continue. I am also very encouraged to hear from so many of you

that municipalities are willing to be partners in supporting our economy, including the oil and gas sectong it I look forward to seeing this commitment reflected in reduced red tape and fiscally prudent decision- making as you plan your budgets and establish tax rates for the coming year.

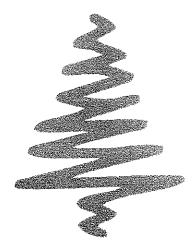
This winter, Stettler Festival of Lights is hosting their 23<sup>rd</sup> annual hospital fundraiser.
