6. Administration: (a) Water Reservoir Painting Request for Quotation (RFQ)

<u>Update</u>

Director of Operations M. Robbins advised there is an approved 2021 capital budget of \$50,000 to paint the exterior of the Water Reservoir. In September of 2021, Town Council awarded the request for quotation (RFQ) to AlumaSafway Inc. in the amount of \$41,173.15.

Scheduling issues arose and the contractor was not able to complete the work before the outside temperatures dropped and hoarding would have been required, which was not included in the work. The decision to delay the work to summer of 2022 was agreed to between AlumaSafway and the Town. May 2022, AlumaSafway requested an approved expenditure for product prices increases, which the terms of the quotation allows. The revised quote is \$98,000 – \$105,000. Administration has been unsuccessful negotiating a reasonable price increase to complete the work and therefore is recommending cancelling the RFQ award to AlumaSafway and sending the project out for new quotations. AlumaSafway Inc. agrees to these terms.

3. <u>4:35pm – Manager of Recreation & Culture Brad Robbins – Stettler Recreation Centre Rates and Summer 2022 Events</u>

Mayor Nolls welcomed A. King, B. Robbins, S. Dodd to the meeting.

B. Robbins advised that current Stettler Recreation Centre / Ball and Soccer Policy that outlines rates and fees expires in December 2022 and is currently under review. B. Robbins and S. Dodd highlighted their presentation that provided the background as to how the recreation rates were established, the principles and philosophies that have been recognized by Council such as a 50% subsidized rate for youth and minor sport organizations, and a proposed timeline for the implementation of an updated policy.

BACKGROUND

- Purpose is to establish rental rates for the Stettler Recreation Centre, Sports Fields, Meeting Spaces, etc.
- Policies also establish programming fee's for pool & fitness centre
- Also provide guidance related to additional revenue sources such as sponsorship, lease spaces, etc.
- Current policies are in the last year of a five year rate adjustment which worked well for user groups.
- 5 Year agreement allowed for users to plan and made increases easy to communicate.



PRINCIPLES AND PHILOSOPHIES

- Public Use Factor Public facilities have a general availability/usage that is not related to the user group which is factored into each facility as a %.
- Local Minor Sports Groups have 50% of the fee waived. (i.e. hourly ice cost is \$80/hr vs \$160/hr)
- Joint Use Agreements
 - County of Stettler contribution applied directly against overall costs
 - Clearview School Division Free exchange of facilities (does not include pool and Hockey Academy)



SRC ICE FEE'S

- Current-\$160/hr-increased \$5/year over last 5 years
 - Minor Sports \$80/hr (starts approx. October 1 st)
 - · Hockey Academy \$56 (during day)
 - Facility Cost Share (85% User/15% Public)
- New Consideration(s):
 - Non Prime Ice Fee to encourage more usage of facility during non peak times (i.e. Weekdays 8:00 am – 4:00 pm)
 - Service Fee's Junior B/Senior
- Other Factors to Consider:
 - · Hockey/Figure Skating begins in September now vs October
 - Market Place Fee's, Demand
 - Loss of Junior B and some adult rec teams.







POOL FEE'S

- ➤ Pool Admission -has not increased in 5 years. This will be looked at in future meeting.
- ➤ Pool Rentals
 - CHALLENGE Current patron ration is 50 to 1 guard the recommended ratio change as of January 1, 2020 is 40 to 1 therefore changes to Birthday party package etc. to reflect the change.
 - Recommend that the public package increases to \$75.00 for 20 patrons with \$15.00 for every 5 people over. Current is \$65.00 for 15 patrons.
- ➤ No current sponsor swim which was being charge out at \$115.00 per hour with no patron cap.
 - Recommend that we have a Sponsor swim or Youth group rental (schools, clubs, church groups) at a \$115.00 per hour for patrons 1-100 increase \$50.00 for every 75 patrons more.





POOL FEE's cont.

Swimming lessons and Swim Club Fees

- As of January 1, Red Cross announced they are no longer supporting water safety which was our main lesson structure.
- Moving to Swim for life lessons plus no increase in lessons over the past 7 years
 - o Recommendation to increase Swim for life Preschool to Swim for life level 3 to \$45.00
 - Swim for life level 4 to Swim patrol star to \$52.00 this is an increase of \$5.00, inflation and different program







SPORTS FIELD FEE'S

- Current Based on a seasonal rate vs yearly
 - Ball (\$5600) Soccer (\$7400) Adult Teams (\$430)
 - Facility Cost Share (60% User/40% Public)
- New Considerations:
 - Day Use Rate Single Day access (i.e. corporate ball game, non user group tournament)
 - Servicing Fee's Tournaments (Additional Porta Potty's, Garbage, Field Maintenance)
- Other Factors to Consider:
 - Seasonal Structure
 - Increased demand for service/higher expectations.
 - · Hourly fee comes with different servicing components

It was noted that Town recreation rates currently being charged to youth user groups, as ultimately set in policy, are generally on the lower end in comparison with other similar sized Albertan communities for the service level being provided.

Following discussion, it was agreed to maintain the 50% fee subsidy for youth and minor organizations, and to proceed with a 2–3-year plan that can be reviewed at anytime should circumstances arise or change over the course of the plan.

Recreation revenue challenges moving forward in 2022 and 2023 (post-COVID) reflect a significant decline in "adult" user group rentals including:

- No Junior B hockey
- Reduced men's recreation hockey teams
- No slow-pitch league

- B. Robbins advised that the Entertainment in the Park lineup has been set, with the first show taking place on June 22nd. Concerts will continue every Wednesday night at 7pm in West Stettler Park through the end of August.
- B. Robbins advised that in honour of Canada's 155th Birthday, a special selection of events has been planned for July 1st. Events begin at the Stettler & Country Museum with the following:

All parking lots in the area will be accessible with the exception of West Stettler Park West Lot.

4. Stettler Dirt Riders Association Funding Request

CAO G. Switenky advised that at the May 17th Council Meeting, Laurence Fisher presented a funding request to Town Council on behalf of the Stettler Dirt Riders Association. The subject land is owned by the Town of Stettler and leased by the Stettler Dirt Riders Association. The current lease has expired. The request for support included the provision of materials to shape and prepare the entry road to the track, and some internal mowing to assist with the operational costs of the organization. It was also noted that the same request was made to the County of Stettler. Following the recent County of Stettler Council meeting, it was suggested that the Town of Stettler and the County of Stettler formalize a plan for the upgrade of the internal entryway and roadway, with equipment costing and material to be presented at the next County Council meeting. General discussion took place regarding Policy VIII-4 – Miscellaneous Requests for Funding – Fundraising Initiatives. Following discussion, it was agreed that the supply of excess materials such as pavement millings and crushed concrete does not contradict Policy VIII-4. The Town of Stettler frequently supplies excess materials to various organizations to use in parking lots or internal roadways.

Motion – Moved by Councillor C. Barros that it be recommended to Town Council that subject to a new lease being signed by the Stettler Dirt Bikers Association, the Town of Stettler will partner with the County of Stettler and supply excess materials for the reconstruction of the entryway and internal roadway, and further and internal mowing would continue to be the responsibility of the Stettler Dirt Bikers Association.

5. Stettler Hospital ER Temporary Closure

CAO G. Switenky advised that on June 9th, 2022, the Town of Stettler Administration was advised by Alberta Health Services that the Stettler Hospital's Emergency Room would not 'be staffed by a physician for a 24-hour period due to staffing challenges. This also occurred on May 25th, 2022. CAO G. Switenky advised that he and Mayor Sean Nolls have a meeting

scheduled with the AHS Zone Medical Director on June 22^{nd} to discuss the matter. Following the discussion, it was agreed that the closure of the Stettler Emergency Room due to doctor shortages is very frustrating for the Town of Stettler. Alberta Health Services (AHS) own and operate the Stettler Hospital Complex including the newly renovated Emergency Room and to have it closed due to doctor shortages is unacceptable. It seems there has been a serious deterioration in accountability on behalf of AHS or the Province of Alberta to the residents of Stettler and surrounding area. The Town of Stettler is very much looking forward to the meeting on June 22, and would very much like to know where is the accountability in the form of a news release or public engagement, what was the effect of having the Emergency Room closed over those 2-24-hour periods and finally what is AHS plan in the future so the Emergency Room does not close again due to doctor shortages.

Dear Community Partner,

Please find attached the quarterly Community Policing Report for Stettler. This report serves to provide an overview of the human resources, financial data, and crime statistics for the January 1st to March 31st, 2022 reporting period. Community engagement remains a top priority for the Alberta RCMP, and the consistent delivery of these quarterly reports is but one of a number of projects we have underway. Our Body Worn Camera program and our new mobile app for iOS and Android devices are two other initiatives that ensure we remain transparent and accountable to you for the work we do.

Body Worn Cameras increase the transparency of police interactions with citizens. Included in this Community Policing Report package is an updated overview on Body Worn Cameras, which will enter into a field test phase later this year. As mentioned in previous correspondence, the Federal Government recognizes that this was not in the multi-year financial plans for Contract Partners, and thus has agreed to fund the first 3 years of the roll-out. This has allowed some time for Contract Partners to factor this into their future planning processes (i.e. MYFP). As we are currently awaiting the vendor procurement process to finalize, we are unable to provide community-specific cost estimates. Once costing is confirmed, we will provide financial forecasting to our communities with Municipal Policing Service Agreements.

Alberta RCMP has launched a new mobile app for iOS and Android devices, that allows for Albertans to access information without delay. The app is available as a free download through Apple or Google Play, and will provide your community members with online access to news, crime reporting, detachment locations, crime mapping and statistics. The app also contains links to partner law enforcement services, mental health supports, Crime Stoppers and connects to Alberta RCMP social media accounts. Even though the app provides convenient links to Alberta RCMP social media accounts, it will not replace other methods of crime reporting, engagement, or emergency assistance. I solicit your support to remind all of your community members that social media posts or use of other third-party crime apps are not

appropriate ways to report a crime. The Alberta RCMP app complies with Canadian privacy laws for mobile apps set out by the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada and the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta and will not track or monitor users in any way.

The attached reporting and attachments, along with your valued feedback and guidance, will reinforce your policing priorities and help ensure we are meeting the growing and shifting demands of your community. As the Chief of Police in your community, I sincerely appreciate and encourage you to reach out with any questions or concerns.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) is committed to ensuring that Canadians feel protected by, and have trust in their national police force. Body-worn cameras can help to increase the trust between police and the communities they serve.



- front-line RCMP officers will soon be wearing body-worn cameras.
- → between 10,000-15,000 body-worn cameras will be deployed to contract and federal police officers who interact with communities, across Canada's rural, urban and remote locations.
- the video evidence collected will provide an independent, unbiased, and objective way to capture interactions between the community and police officers.
- work is ongoing to acquire body-worn cameras and a Digital Evidence Management System (DEMS) to support a nation-wide rollout of camera as as quickly as possible.
- a field test, with up to 300 cameras will take place in three different Divisions of the RCMP - Alberta (K Division), Nova Scotia (H Division), Nunavut (V Division). The testing will take place in northern/remote, rural, and urban settings.

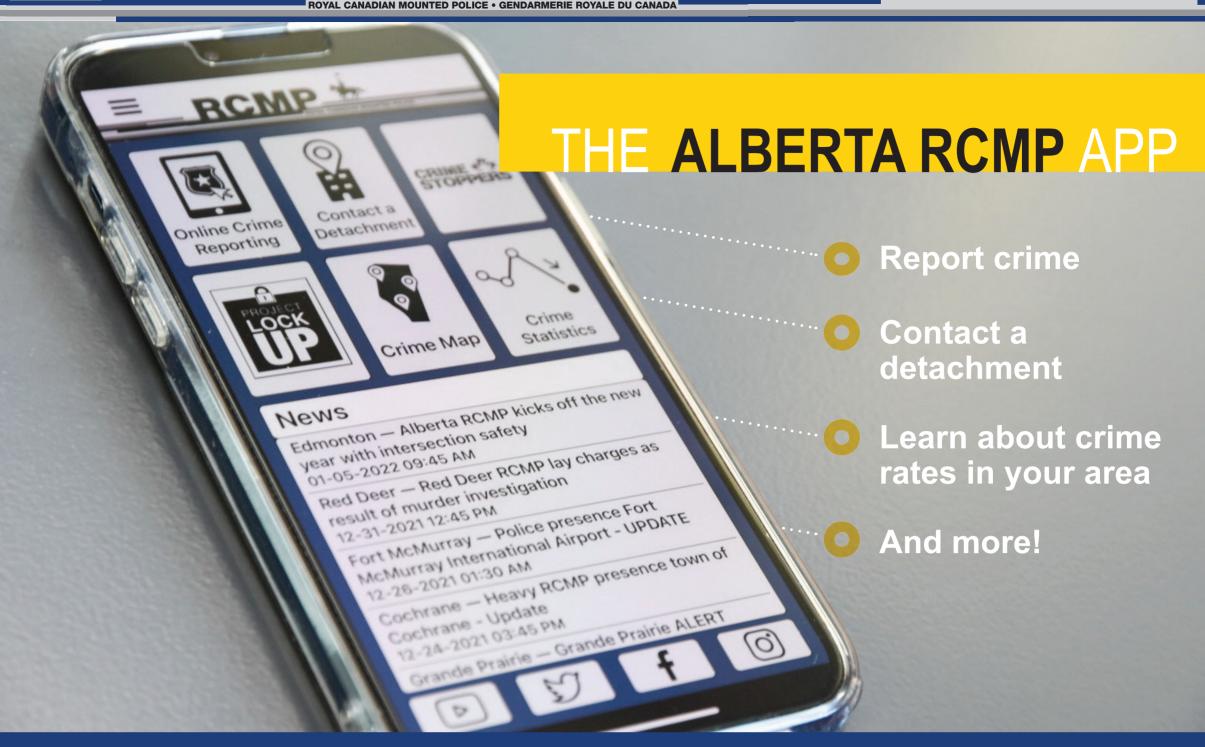

Background:

2022 Capital Budget project to sand and refinish the Stettler Community Hall dance floor \$15,000. In addition to the tender completed for the Stettler Community Hall we requested a price quote to complete a refinish of the Hub.

Summary of tenders received by town office on June 15, 2022

- Caliber Sport Systems Inc (used by Clearview School Division)\$14,900 for sand, seal & finish Community Hall. \$4,900 to seal and finish the Hub. Total cost of \$19,800. Completion date October 30, 2022
- Craftsman Floors Ltd (used by Christ King School) \$8652 for sand, seal & finish Community Hall. \$3,845 to seal and finish the Hub. Total cost of \$12,497.00. Completion date October 29, 2022

Tenders do not include GST or contingency.

Recommendation:

Administration is recommending to award the sand, seal and refinish work of the Stettler Community Hall dance floor to Craftsman Floors Ltd at \$8,652.

Administration further recommends that as a result of the price received that we include the seal and finish work of the Hub floor to be completed as part of the 2022 capital budget and award to Craftsman Floors at \$3,845.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT SUPERVISOR - CHRIS SAUNDERS

- 1. The main waterline from the plant to town was swabbed.
- 2. We have removed 2 Octoair aerators from the Low Lift pumphouse and relocated them into the reservoir by the outlet to the treatment plant. According to Cleartech a couple of other plants here in Alberta have done likewise to help with manganese issues.
- 3. Aqutech divers were contracted to clean and inspect our clearwell at the water treatment plant.
- 4. Both of the settling tanks were drained down and washed out and internals inspected.
- 5. We have tried a new acid clean on our microfilters as we have had a decrease in the capacity of the racks. The new acid is supposed to be better at cleaning out manganese fouling. A small improvement was noticed with the first clean.
- 6. The raw water reservoir was lowered and the sediment levels were measured.
- 7. The AMC analyzer has been scheduled for it's biannual maintenance with the HACH Tech.
- 8. The cathodic protection survey is scheduled for early June.
- 9. Routine monthly maintenance carried out.
- 10. The river is quite low again this spring and may present some challenges as the summer progresses.
