a) completely self-contained planters with a floor and fully assembled 3'x4' \$325 3'x6' \$475 4'x8' \$650



b) "Secondly, we could build planters on site with no bottom that would still last forever using our 2x6 and 1x6 lumber, this way materials would come in at \$300 for a 4'x8' planter. I would donate my time to help organize this with tools and plans as Stettler is my home town and I feel this would be a great project. A linear economy: Take (from the planet), make, toss.


