8. <u>Hospital</u>

Karen Phibbs requested more contribution from the Town to spruce up the grounds at the hospital. A. King wondered if this was a project that the HBC Committee would want to take on. It was noted that a lot of stuff was already done there. The committee feels it is not something they want to start doing since it is private property. Focus should be spent on public areas. A. King will contact her as the request was sent to the Town and not HBC.

9. 2023 Projects

a) Stettler Blooms

- Murals
 - There was discussion on whether we should be putting a mural on the Stettler Hotel and to what extent the HBC should contribute.

- Mason Project

- Community Gardens
 - \circ High school to build a shed for the South Gardens. It will be 6'x8'x7' with vinyl siding and no window, handmade door and on skids at a cost of materials + 10%

- 10 Raised beds for the community gardens will be ordered this year for spring delivery to use this year's budget. Because the prices were old, G. Fix will get updated pricing for 10 4'x8' boxes with no bottoms. Motion will be made once pricing comes in.
- Cardboard can be collected and stored in the Central Garden Shed until spring
- Community Orchard
 - B. Bowie reported that the water was turned off before the last watering could be done. Thankfully it rained
 - Should be good for winter.
 - B. Bowie reported that the water manifold is gone. A. King noted that the water department brought it to the rink
 - B. Bowie will show some of the HBC members how to hook up and water the gardens in the spring.
 - $\circ~$ B. Bowie recommended we add more mulch to hold the water in.

A. King noted that there is enough mulch at the shop to do this

- Suggested that it may be better to use the chipping from the Christmas trees for the orchard
- Benches for the Orchard- A. King will call Dallas
- Beautiful Yard signs
 - T. Wilson will do another Facebook post to see if any signs come back

 - G. Fix suggested maybe using cheaper flowers to have enough to fill the planters.
